## Howe Dell Remembrance Assembly



On Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November, seven ex pupils of Howe Dell School from Year 7 returned for a special assembly to remember people who served in the armed forces over the past hundred years. Mrs Massey, Howe Dell Headteacher, stressed that this was also an important opportunity to give thanks for peace.

The Bishop's representatives joined a packed audience of neighbours, emergency services' personnel, parents, governors and veterans, all whom have connections with the school. There were poignant photographs of aircraft built at the deHavilland site. A display of artefacts the children brought in drew our attention at the end of the assembly. One junior girl had painted a landscape with poppies, which was very moving. Several of the Howe Dell pupils proudly wore their Brownie, Beaver and Cub uniforms, and were obviously impressed by the Air Cadets who were at the centre of the 2 minutes' silence. Even the nursery children stood still and silent in contemplation, after hearing the Last Post.

It was a valuable trip back to Howe Dell, which moved us all tremendously.
