

Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School

Dear Parents / Carers,

The end of the Autumn Term is rapidly approaching and a number of festivities are planned to get us all ready for Christmas. We have our Christmas Concert on Monday 9th December, our Christmas Market at lunchtime on Friday 13th December, Year 7 pupils attending our annual Christmas Service at St Etheldreda's Church on the afternoon of Monday 16th December and our Prize and Certificate Evening on Thursday 19th December. Girls have also been entering into the "giving" spirit of Christmas by filling and decorating their reverse advent calendars for the local Food Bank. These have now been delivered to the Food Bank whose organisers were very appreciative of the girls' efforts; the contents of the boxes will bring much cheer to those most needy at this time of year.

Christmas Market

As mentioned above, Years 7 and 8 are busy organising their stalls for the popular Christmas Market which will take place on Friday 13th December. At this, they will be selling Christmas gifts for the family such as homemade crafts and biscuits as well as providing games and activities. We hope that all pupils will bring loose change into school that day to make purchases and to enjoy the Christmas activities on offer. Parents of Years 7 and 8 pupils are invited to attend the Market to join in the fun between 12.45 and 1.45pm.

And then one after our school choir sang at the concert for Willow at St Alban's Abbey on 3rd December:

"Last night I did my regular gig hosting and conducting the Willow Foundation Carol Concert in the Cathedral with the Founders of the charity Bob (ex Arsenal and Scotland goalkeeper) and Megs Wilson co-hosting. As usual the Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School Choir sang a couple of numbers. Delightful and well behaved young ladies who sang beautifully. Great ambassadors for the School."

We have been supporting the Willow Foundation for a number of years as it is a local charity, set up by Bob and Megs Wilson after the death of their daughter Anna (an ex-Bishop's girl) to give 16-40 year olds suffering from life-threatening conditions a chance to have a special day making memories. We are currently selling raffle tickets for the Willow Christmas raffle; these can be purchased for £5 each via Wisepay until 12th December 2019. The raffle will be drawn during the Christmas Market on 13th December and the winner will be notified to come and collect their prize which is a Regency Luxury Hamper full of tasty treats just in time for Christmas!

End of Autumn Term

This term finishes on Friday 20th December at 12.30pm. Girls will have end of term assemblies and tutor time on this day as well as being entertained with a Staff Panto; as part of our fundraising initiatives, girls can also wear Christmas jumpers on top of or apply Christmas decorations to their school uniform, eg a string of tinsel as a scarf, on this day for which they pay £2 split equally between the Save the Children charity and our savings for audio-visual equipment to support your daughters' learning. Hot snacks will be available at break but there will be no meal service at lunchtime. Girls in receipt of free school meals will be able to use their allocation at break. We ask that all girls have left the school site by 1pm at the latest.

Start of Spring Term

Monday 6th January 2020 is the first day of term and learning will start as normal. We expect all girls in school by 8.30am. We would ask for your support in ensuring that your daughter starts the term with the correct uniform and complies with our rules concerning make-up and hair. Girls who do not comply will be sent home on the first day of term.

House Points

During the last week of the Autumn Term, Form Tutors will be spending time with the girls reflecting on their behaviour, attainment and achievements for the academic year so far. As a part of this reflection, pupils will be filling in how many positive and negative House Points they have received and setting themselves targets for next term. This can be found on page 13 of your daughter's planner. As a part of this reflection, parents/carers are encouraged to read these and also add a comment in support. This will hopefully give your daughter an opportunity to share with you her achievements this academic year thus far.

Department for Education's statistics acknowledge BHGS achievement

Each year the Department for Education produces performance tables alongside progress reports which focus on the achievement of the previous year's Year 11 pupils in their GCSEs and determines the degree to which they are achieving compared to national averages in different categories. Data shows that we continue to achieve above national averages. This is particularly commendable because the statistics include all state-funded schools and academies, some of which have full or partial selection according to ability – Bishop's only selects according to gender!

The key measure remains Progress 8 which determines how much progress a pupil has made since Year 6. Our 2019 figure is currently **0.44** which is classified as Above Average and shows that we have improved for the third year in a row. This also places Bishop's in the highest 20% of schools nationally.

Bad Weather Conditions

It is becoming increasingly difficult to predict what will happen with our variable weather but we have been checking our communication systems to ensure that should there be any need for school closure over the winter, then processes are in place. We will continue to use our text messaging system to inform parents of any closure and also post information on the website and Facebook.

We would like to clarify where we stand in terms of decisions made to close the school. Essentially, we will do all we can to keep the school open and not interrupt your daughter's education if at all possible; we do understand that for many parents, losing a day's pay to stay at home to care for your daughter can have a real impact and many adults are expected to make their way to work somehow in such extreme conditions. We also understand concerns that parents have regarding dangerous road conditions and we will consider all the advice available before deciding whether to close the school or not. A significant degree of communication (including with all local schools) takes place behind the scenes and in the very early hours of the morning before any decision is made. Meanwhile, we suggest that you ensure your daughter has appropriate outdoor clothing and shoes for bad weather; the mornings have started to get colder and there is frost on the ground, however, some girls are still arriving in school with very flimsy footwear and no coat.

Car Parking and the Drop-off Zone

Please be aware of the following for the safety of pupils:

 No parking or waiting is permitted in the drop-off zone – the double yellow lines apply as on the public highway; parents/carers should not arrive early and wait as this is not a parking area – you will be asked to move on

- When picking up at 3pm, you should wait on the road or in one of the nearby car parks; please do NOT block local residents' driveways
- When picking up after 3.30pm the gate and barrier will be open so parents may park and wait for pupils in the staff car park. Please do not wait in the drop off zone or on the double yellow lines as access is needed for coaches.

Interested in Teaching?

Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School is a member of the Alban Federation partnership that works in the area to provide teacher training. Each year the Federation trains a large number of adults (55 trainees are currently following the programme in 2019/20), either straight from University or as career changers, and places them in a host school for the year to enable them to complete their training and gain Qualified Teacher Status. All applications are submitted through UCAS (the University Admission System) and the application window is now open for courses starting in September 2020. Courses are available in both Primary and Secondary programmes, with salaries or bursaries available for suitably qualified candidates in many subjects.
