



# Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School

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30th March 2020

Dear Parents/Carers,

As we are now into our second full week of school closure, we hope that you are finding your family settling into some sort of normal working pattern in these highly unusual circumstances. We do understand that remote/home learning has its challenges, and it has been a real adjustment for us all. In the past week, pupils have had to learn to work much more independently, and teaching staff have had to adapt to new ways of setting work and monitoring learning. First and foremost we therefore wish to thank you for all your perseverance and support for your child's home learning to date. It has been great to see so many girls working independently and producing such high quality work at home.

We have had some feedback in the last week that some girls are struggling to complete lesson tasks in the usual time given in class. Without a teacher there to provide support or to give firm time limits for tasks, it can be difficult for girls to complete work independently. We would like to emphasise that girls should only be spending the usual amount of lesson time on tasks set, even if it means that work is not always completed. If a lesson is 50 minutes long then we do not expect a pupil to spend longer than this on that subject. All we ask is that the girls try their best, and communicate with staff, where possible, that the work has either been too challenging or they have not understood it. We would also like to acknowledge that we do understand the practical difficulties that occur when there is shared IT access at home. We would like to emphasise again that although the girls are encouraged to follow the normal timetable of the day, we sometimes know that this is very difficult if another family member has access to computing equipment at the time. We wish to reassure you that it is absolutely fine for the girls to access the work at a different time to the set lesson if they need to, teaching staff do understand that not all pupils may be present during the time of the lesson, but some may need to log on and complete the work at a slightly different time. At the same time, teachers themselves may not always be available during the normal lesson time as many of them have children of their own to supervise at home. They will always endeavour to respond to any questions posted in the classroom by the end of that day.

It is important that we maintain, as far as possible, the high-quality education of the girls throughout the period of school closure. As we all know, getting pupils to remain in the routine of work gives them a sense of purpose and normality which is very important for us all in these

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uncertain times. Teaching staff will continue to post lessons using Google classroom and this is the first port of call for all home learning tasks.

There are three further things we would particularly like to draw your attention to in this letter.

Firstly, we would like to use this time of school closure to continue to celebrate the girls' learning. We will be asking staff to share with the school community any particularly good examples of work completed at home. We encourage your daughters to follow @bhgschool from their Instagram accounts so that they can keep updated with work from their peers. We also ask that they follow Facebook and Twitter where possible too for updates, as well as their year group notices on Google classroom.

Secondly, we would like to give you information about a school competition. We are very keen, where possible, to keep these going so that there are various opportunities for girls to accumulate House Points and girls can still participate in enrichment activities. Staff and students are invited to decorate a hard-boiled or blown egg/s as a person or event from history, take a picture of their creation, and email this to Miss Maisey by Thursday 2nd April. This will be displayed in an online 'Eggshibition' on social media on Friday 3rd April. A copy of a poster advertising this is posted onto your daughter's year/form group google classroom, so please do look on there for more information.

Thirdly, we have attached as a separate document below quite a comprehensive list of suggested websites that will further support and supplement the pupils' learning. This list points the girls towards a variety of different material to deepen or extend their thinking through wider reading and research. It also gives them pointers towards a range of cultural online experiences that they perhaps might not normally have the chance to experience. It can be a challenge for pupils to know quite where to access high quality and accurate information online, so teaching staff have collated a list of the highest quality online resources. Please do print this off, share it, keep it safe....there are lots of useful and interesting resources there to supplement the lessons set and to provide activities for the school holidays when lessons stop.

On a final note, Friday 3rd April marks the end of our Spring term and the start of the Easter holidays. No classwork tasks will be set over this time, apart from homework tasks. Online lessons will resume on Monday 20th April, which is the start of our Summer term.

We hope you have a restful Easter break when we get to it and wish you and your families the best of health.
