Risk of spreading infection	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Regular washing of hands for at least 20 seconds using soap and water Hands to be washed on arrival at school, and as regularly as possible No food to be consumed on the premises Coughs and sneezes to be caught in a tissue and the tissue to be immediately placed in bin, then the person must wash their hands Each person should be asked how they are feeling and whether they or a family member have shown any symptoms of Covid 19. Social distancing markings will be placed in corridors to remind members and staff when walking A one way system will be introduced in main corridors Only go to areas in school you are given permission to do so Wearing a face mask/covering or gloves is not recommended by DfE guidance, however, staff or club members may wear a face mask and/or gloves if they wish Any cuts or abrasions on hands or other exposed skin should be covered with plaster Club members should arrive dressed for their activity rather than changing on site Any behaviour that causes risk to any other person may prevent any future attendance 	Low
Transport	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Public transport should be avoided unless absolutely essential If public transport is used, 2m social distancing must be adhered to All to wash hands on arrival at school regardless of means of travel 	Low
External Doors	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Doors on automatic or propped open so that no contact on door handles Only use the designated entrance door 	Low
Rooms	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Maximum number to be calculated for each class being used to ensure social distancing Rooms may be in different areas of school to minimise risk of contact with other clubs in school Staff and club members must bring their own water filled water bottles, no sharing to avoid cross infection risk Box of tissues and anti-bacterial wipes to be available and provided by club organiser If a teacher needs to access classes in different rooms they will wash hands/use anti-bacterial gel before going to new room Club members to be reminded of no contact rule 	Low

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		 Where possible, there will be no sharing of equipment Activity risk assessments will be reviewed by club organisers and any Covid restrictions added prior to activity taking place 	
Break and waiting times	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Club members, accompanying family members and leaders will be required to be outside when not in class Young club members need to be supervised to ensure no access to other areas in school and minimise contact with other students/staff 	Low
Arrival & Departures	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Staggered arrival and departure times may be beneficial, no waiting in canteen areas to avoid cross contamination Parents must ensure their children do not arrive earlier than the time they are advised Club leaders will ensure that club members immediately leave school at the end of their session Club leaders to ensure parents emphasise new procedures to children External doors to be on automatic or propped open where possible so that contact with doors is minimised Outside meeting point to be arrange for drop off and collection of club members 	Low
Emergency Evacuations	Lettings Staff Club Members	 The usual fire assembly area will be used (MUGA) Each club leader will take their group to a separate area and register them Each group must still maintain social distancing and with other groups 	Low
Students with medical conditions	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Students who are vulnerable – parents must seek medical advice and abide by that as to whether their child should attend classes Students who are highly likely to need medical assistance and interventions will need a risk assessment to determine if they can attend classes 	Low
Toilets & Washing Facilities	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Toilets will be cleaned before and after each hire Club members must adhere to social distancing when using facilities Use soap dispensers and anti-bacterial gel dispensers 	Low
Cleaning	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Cleaning team will attend site out of school hours every day to ensure thorough cleaning of all areas used Cleaning team to be given a list of every room that has been used each day Site team on duty to deal with any immediate issues 	Low
First Aid – no symptoms of Covid 19	Lettings Staff Club Members	 Every club must ensure they have a First Aider on site and a First Aid kit which includes PPE Normal first aid procedures apply unless there is a need to come into close contact with the injured/unwell person in which case PPE should be worn. 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	•	 If anyone displays Covid symptoms, they are to be sat outside or in a designated room on their own with the door closed and if possible, an open window. Family to be contacted for or urgent collection. Any room or toilet used whilst waiting will be closed until it has been cleaned – club leaders to advise school. Anyone who displays symptoms will need to book in to have a test carried out. Until they receive the results of that test, they must self-isolate for 7 days and all in their household must self-isolate for 14 days Other club members and staff who have been in the class with them, do not need to self-isolate unless they have had close physical contact (refer to Government guidelines) If the test result comes back negative, the club member/staff member can return and their households do not need to continue self-isolating If the test comes back positive, self-isolation must continue for the whole household If the person displaying symptoms requires urgent first aid treatment, the first aider must wear PPE comprising of a mask, gloves, eye protection and an apron. These must then be double-bagged and stored for 72 hours before being disposed of in the normal refuse. The first aider must wash hands thoroughly after contact and the affected area cleaned thoroughly
