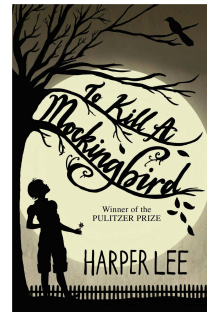

**On the Basis of Sex** is a biopic based on the life of American Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg (2018).

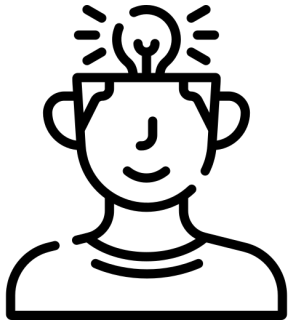
**12 Angry Men** is an American courtroom drama about a jury deliberating the case of an 18-year-old impoverished youth accused of stabbing his father to death (1957).
