The theme for this year, is '**Saluting our Sisters**' to highlight the crucial role of Black women in shaping history, inspiring change and building communities.


The pupil committee be delivering assemblies, providing accompanying optional form-time activities and resources, and organising a lunch-time celebration exhibition.
