Admissions process	
<p>What are the admission rules and how do I find out if I am in the catchment area?</p>	<p>The priority areas for Bishop's Hatfield Girls' School are based on the following towns/parishes/unparished areas: Hatfield, North Mymms, Welwyn, Welwyn Garden City, Woolmer Green, Potters Bar, Knebworth, Codicote</p> <p>Hertfordshire County Council set the Admissions Policy for BHGS. Parents are advised to visit their website at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions to access all the published information on admissions and how to make an application. The closing date for Secondary Applications is October 31st each year for a place in Year 7 in the following September.</p>
<p>What are my chances of getting a place and how can I improve my chances?</p>	<p>The chances of being allocated a place depend on how many others apply, so we cannot answer this question. There is also not much we can say about improving your chances apart from you can only get a place if you do make Bishop's one of your choices and the higher you rank the school, the greater your chance of being allocated to it.</p>
Teaching and learning	
<p>What languages will my daughter study in Year 7?</p>	<p>Your daughter will study 2 languages out of French, German and Spanish. The languages chosen each year depend upon the timetable availability of languages staff. This varies each year.</p> <p>All pupils across Year 7 study the same two chosen languages, there is no difference between tutor groups. We also cannot make any guarantees that a specific language will be chosen nor will we know what languages are chosen until the timetable is finished in late summer. However, we are confident that all pupils will enjoy a creative approach to learning languages as well as exploring other cultures.</p>
<p>Do we set or band by ability in year 7?</p>	<p>The only subjects that are banded by ability in Year 7 are maths, science and computing. For these linked subjects, pupils are taught in three ability bands.</p> <p>The initial grouping is informed by Key Stage 2 test scores and Teacher Assessments as well as any particular information gained from Primary visits. CATs can also be used. Early in the Autumn Term, Year 7 will sit a baseline Maths test to confirm their groupings and to highlight topics from KS2 that need to be revised either as a class or individually.</p> <p>Setting across a wider range of subjects takes place from Year 9.</p>

<p>My daughter is shy and is worried about settling into secondary school. How does the school support the new Year 7 pupils?</p>	<p>At Bishop's we aim to make the transition from primary to Year 7 as smooth as possible, and will always be in touch with the primary school who know the individual pupils. We try to visit every pupil in their primary school during the summer term before they start. <p>How do you deal with bullying?</p>	<p>We have a clear Anti-Bullying Policy and treat any form of bullying seriously. Bullying is rare, but can happen in any school. We have skilled staff who work with all parties to resolve problems and move forward. We also have a very strong behaviour code that makes our expectations clear to all.</p>
<p>Extra-curricular</p>	
<p>What sorts of trips and visits do pupils get to take part in?</p>	<p>We offer an extensive enrichment programme, both in and out of school. Each faculty area runs a range of trips to a variety of destinations, including museums, galleries, theatres, and cultural centres. There are also field trips for specialist subjects and overseas trips such as to the WWI Battlefields and to support foreign language learning.
