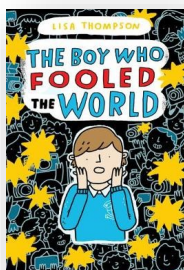




The House of One Hundred Clocks

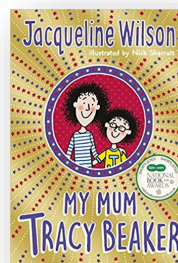
Things the Eye Can't See

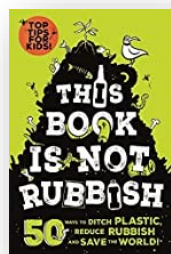

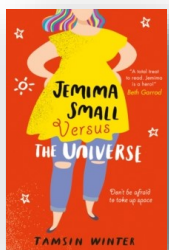
***The Boy Who Met a Whale*

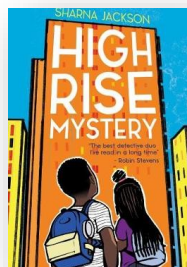
***This Book is not Rubbish*

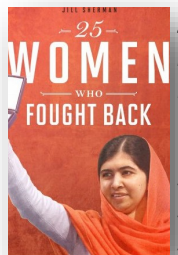
***High Rise Mystery*

Discover 25 women who challenged the status quo and fought for what they believed in. From all corners of the globe, these women show that barriers are meant to be broken and obstacles can be overcome.



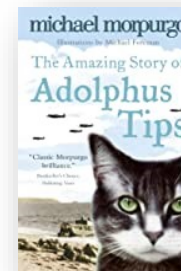
***Nothing Ever Happens Here*
