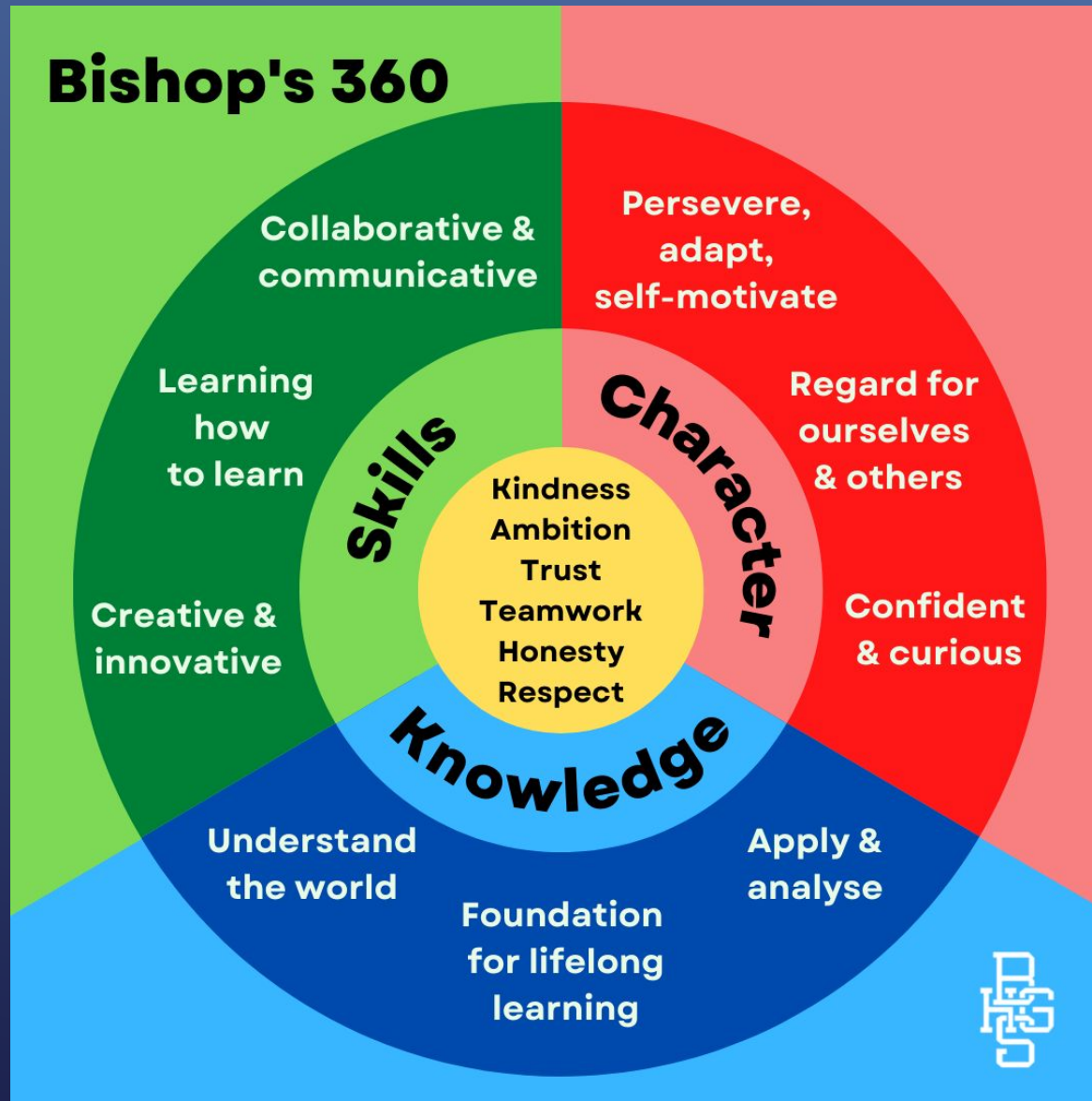

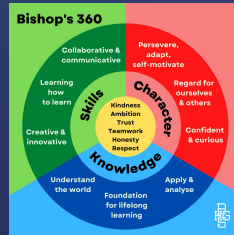
BISHOP'S SIXTH FORM – ACHIEVING OUR POTENTIAL AND ENJOYING THE JOURNEY

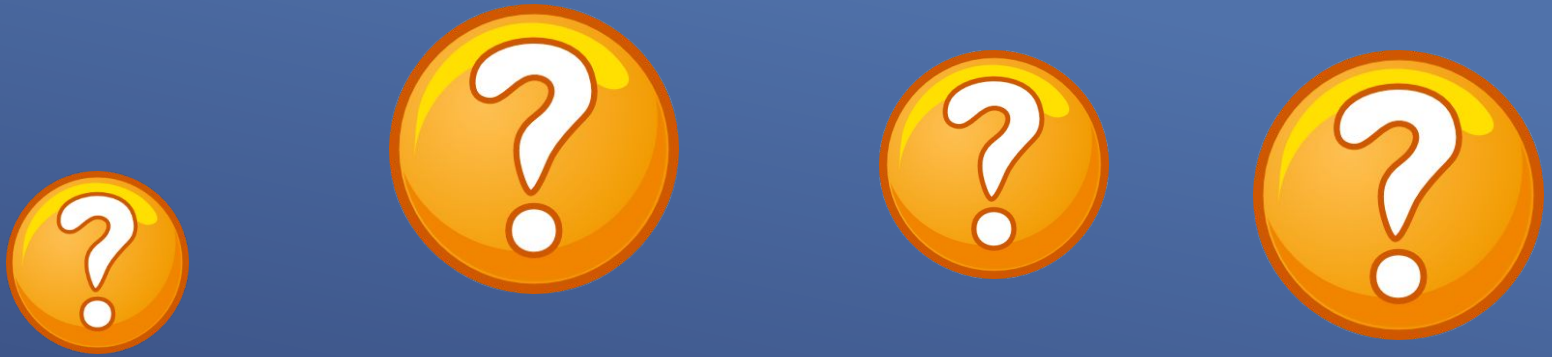

What are the entry requirements?

Course	Entry Requirement (APS)
3+ A Levels	APS 4.5 or above Subject based criteria 9-4 grade in English and Maths
2 A Levels and 1 Vocational Level 3	APS 4 or above Subject based criteria 9-4 grade in English and Maths
1 A Level and 2 Vocational Level 3	APS 3.8 or above Subject based criteria 9-4 grade in English
Vocational Level 3 combination	APS 3.7 or above Subject based criteria 9-4 grade in English

What courses and subjects do Bishop's offer?

Level 3 'Full' Courses:

- ▶ GCE A Levels
- ▶ Vocational Courses (BTEC, WJEC, NCFE, LIBF, Cambridge Technical)

Most students will have 3 subjects

Level 3 'Additional' Courses:

- ◆ Mathematical Studies L3 (Core Maths)
- ◆ Extended Project Qualification
- ◆ Further Maths (A Level)

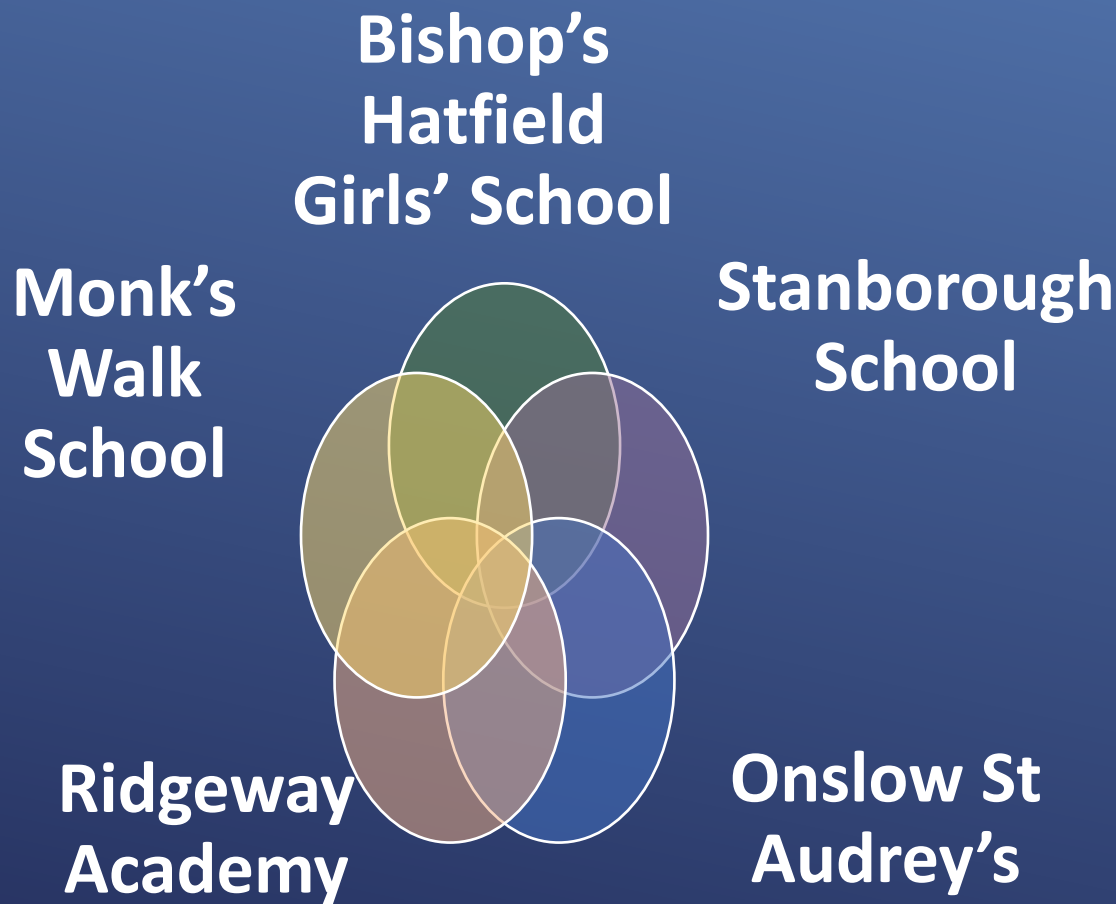

Leadership structure

Take on responsibility in a leadership role

Taking on leadership roles and positions of responsibility is an important part of being a sixth-former at Bishop's and nearly all our students take up these opportunities to develop their skills and talents. Roles are available at different levels with our student leadership structure. Examples include:



Head Student

This is the most senior role and involves working closely with the senior leadership team to run the School Council, oversee prefects and represent the school. There are also opportunities to support younger pupils, such as through mentoring, sustainability initiatives or enrichment activities.



Senior Prefect

Leading and supporting school activities and younger pupils as Anti-bullying Leaders, Events Ambassadors, Sustainability Champions, Sixth Form Transition Leaders.



Academic/Pastoral Prefect

Mentoring GCSE pupils or supporting younger years with Maths or Literacy activities; supporting new Year 7 in their transition to secondary school or acting as personal coaches.



Subject Prefect

Representing specific subjects (e.g. Science, Languages, Library) at school events and providing support within that Department, e.g. in enrichment and sporting clubs.



House Captain and Vice-Captain

Inspiring younger pupils to get involved in House events as well as supporting the organisation of these activities.

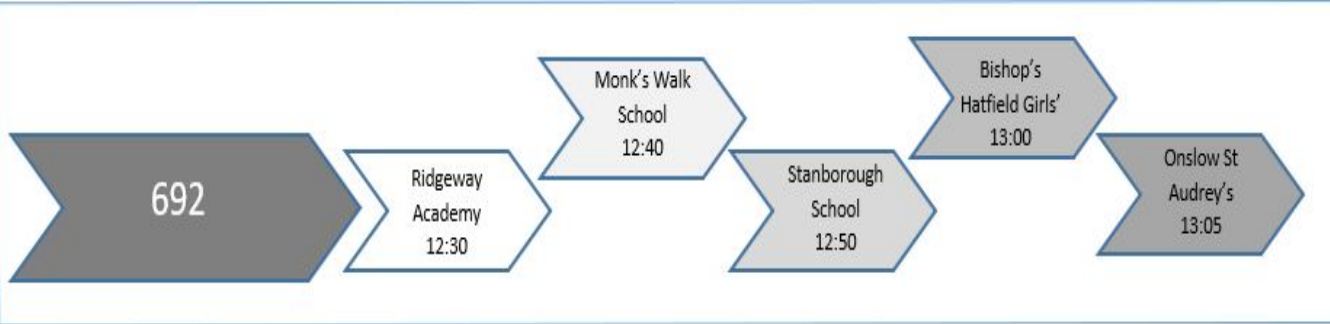
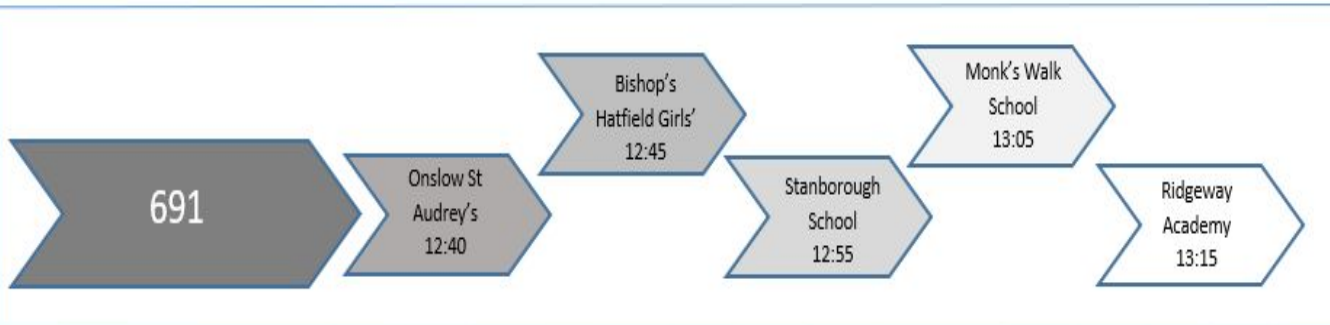

- ▶ Consortium Events, e.g. Higher Education Convention, Oxbridge Application Talk, Careers Conference, University Challenge.

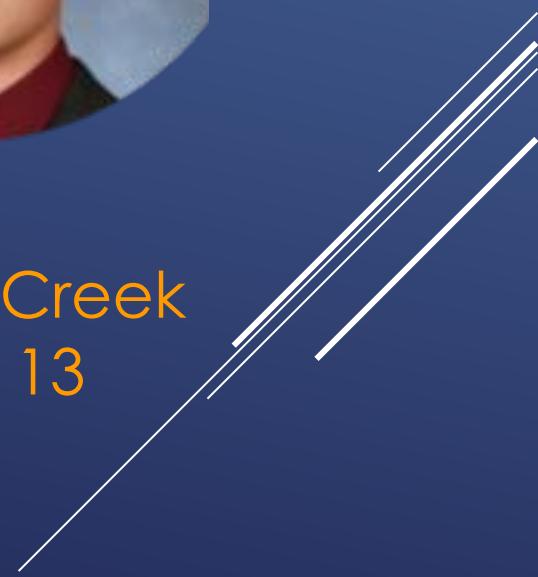

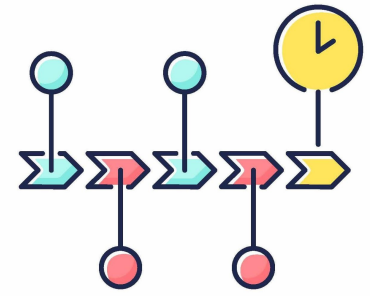

- ❑ Now - Add in Expression of Interest
- ❑ 2nd -13th December Mocks - with practical beforehand
- ❑ 15th January -Year 11 Reports
- ❑ January new predicted grades - Parents' Evening 16th January
- ❑ 17th January - year 11 interviews for post-16 choices.
- ❑ 24th January - deadline for submission of Application Forms - online only
- ❑ Offers to 6th Form at Bishop's will be made by the end of the Spring Term (20th March) – these need to be accepted to secure a place.
